Presidential Doomsday Plane's Arrival in D.C. Raises Concerns

The arrival of the Air Force's "Doomsday Plane" at Joint Base Andrews in Maryland has elevated fears that the U.S. may be on the verge of a major confrontation in the Middle East. The E-4B "Nightwatch" is a militarized Boeing 747 capable of surviving a nuclear blast and would serve as central command for the president and key military leaders in the event of a nuclear confrontation. As of Wednesday evening, President Donald Trump said he has reviewed and approved a military option for the U.S. to engage directly with Iran but has thus far withheld from giving a formal go-ahead.

While the four E-4Bs are in a regular flight rotation to maintain operational readiness, Wednesday's flight issued a callsign of ORDER01, instead of the typical ORDER6, according to data from the flight tracking site FlightRadar.

Putin Holds Separate Talks With Israel, Iran

Russian President Vladimir Putin held separate talks with Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu and Iranian President Masoud Pezeshkian following Israel's attack against Iran, Newsweek reported Friday.

When speaking to Netanyahu, per the Kremlin, Putin "emphasized the importance of resuming the negotiations and resolving any issues pertaining to Iran's nuclear program exclusively via political and diplomatic means. In addition, the Russian leader expressed willingness to provide mediation so as to prevent further escalation."

In his call with Pezeshkian, Putin "stressed that Russia condemned Israel's actions, which had been carried out in violation of the UN Charter and international law. The Russian side has been fully supporting the efforts to resolve the situation around Iran's nuclear program peacefully and has proposed concrete initiatives aimed at reaching mutually acceptable agreements."

Israel launches preemptive strike on Iran, DM declares special state of emergency

Channels in Iran associated with the Revolutionary Guards report explosions in Tehran. Defense Minister Israel Katz immediately declares a special state of emergency throughout the entire territory of the State of Israel. Israeli airspace shut down.

The IDF Spokesperson's Unit officially announced on Friday morning that "following the directive of the political echelon, the IDF launched a

preemptive, precise, combined offensive based on high-quality intelligence to strike Iran's nuclear program, and in response to the Iranian regime's ongoing aggression against Israel."

"A short while ago, dozens of IAF jets completed the first stage that included strikes on dozens of military targets, including nuclear targets in different areas of Iran."

"The public is requested to follow the instructions of the IDF Home Front Command, which will be updated as necessary, and act calmly and responsibly. The IDF and the relevant authorities are prepared for a wide range of scenarios in defense and offense that may be needed," said the IDF.

"For years, the Iranian regime has been waging a direct and indirect campaign of terror against the State of Israel, by funding and directing terrorist activities via its proxies across the Middle East, while advancing toward obtaining a nuclear weapon. The Iranian regime is at the head of the axis responsible for all terrorist attacks against the State of Israel since the beginning of the 'Swords of Iron' War, including by arming and funding the Hamas terror organization which was responsible for the October 7th Massacre. During the "Swords of Iron" War, Iran even directly attacked Israel twice, firing hundreds of missiles toward the State of Israel." "The Iranian regime has proclaimed that its objective is to destroy the State of Israel. Senior officials in the Iranian regime have publicly declared their intent to destroy Israel, and are operating to achieve this together with their proxies in the Middle East. Today, Iran is closer than ever to obtaining a nuclear weapon. Weapons of mass destruction in the hands of the Iranian regime are an existential threat to the State of Israel and a significant threat to the wider world. The State of Israel will not allow a regime whose objective is to destroy the State of Israel to obtain weapons of mass destruction."

The statement noted, "The IDF has conducted a process of preparations for a campaign on the frontline and on the home front. The resilience of Israel's citizens will be an important factor of the campaign."

"The IDF is ready to continue to act as required. The State of Israel has the obligation to act in defense of its citizens and will continue to do so everywhere it is required to do so, as we have done in the past."

"The IDF is conducting an ongoing situational assessment and will update on any developments," the statement concluded.

Earlier, channels in Iran associated with the Revolutionary Guards reported explosions in Tehran, as Israel launched its preemptive strike in Iran.

Iran International reported that homes of senior political and defense officials in Iran were attacked.

An Israeli defense official stated, "The likelihood is increasing that the Iranian General Staff, including the Iranian Chief of Staff, and senior nuclear scientists were eliminated in the opening strike."

Israel's Security Cabinet gathered for an emergency meeting.

Meanwhile, *CNN* reported that US President Donald Trump will convene his own Cabinet for a meeting.

At the same time, sirens were sounded throughout Israel.

Defense Minister Israel Katz said, "Following a preemptive strike by the State of Israel against Iran, a missile and drone attack is expected against the State of Israel and its civilian population in the immediate timeframe." "Therefore, in accordance with his authority under the Civil Defense Law, Defense Minister Israel Katz has signed a special order, pursuant to which a special state of emergency will be imposed throughout the entire territory of the State of Israel."

The public is urged to follow the instructions of the Home Front Command and the authorities and to remain in protected spaces.

The IDF Spokesperson's Unit stated, "Following the situational assessment, it was determined that as of today (Friday), at 03:00, immediate changes will be made to the Home Front Command Guidelines."

"As part of the changes, it was decided to shift all areas of the country from Full Activity to Essential Activity."

The guidelines include: a prohibition on educational activities, gatherings, and workplaces, except for essential sectors.

"We are in a strategic window of opportunity. We have reached a point of no return; there is no choice but to act now," sources in the IDF stated. The IDF is preparing for an operation lasting at least several days, including expectations of heavy barrages from the Iranians. The IDF further emphasizes that the operation's goal is "to eliminate threats to the entire State of Israel, targeting the Iranian regime's nuclear program and its long-range missile firing capabilities. The timing was chosen after recent indications that Iran is racing toward a nuclear bomb. The project is at a stage where, if we do not act now, we will know less with each passing day."

Additionally, the IDF notes that Iran possesses thousands of ballistic missiles, which in themselves constitute an existential threat. "The IDF has identified attempts to arm proxies in the Middle East against the State of Israel, which in recent years have begun formulating a concrete plan to destroy the State of Israel. Soon, the IDF will launch a campaign asking the public not to share locations of strikes or to document them, and we will work to provide at least a ten-minute warning before missile launches or any other type of event."

Arab ministers gather to attack Israel

Ministers from Saudi Arabia, Jordan, and Egypt accuse Israel of extremism and demand unilateral steps while sidestepping Hamas terror.

Arab foreign ministers made a series of critical statements targeting Israel during a press conference on Sunday, held by the ministerial committee formed following the Arab-Islamic Summit on Gaza. The officials reiterated calls for the establishment of a Palestinian state and addressed developments in the region.

Saudi Foreign Minister Prince Faisal bin Farhan condemned Israel for preventing the Arab ministerial delegation from visiting Ramallah, stating: "Preventing the Arab ministerial delegation from visiting Ramallah is a manifestation of the Israeli government's extremism." He added, "These actions will only increase our determination to intensify diplomatic efforts in the international community to confront Israel's arrogance."

He also said, "Military solutions will not bring security to any party. A political solution is imperative. We will not accept any resolution short of establishing a Palestinian state."

Jordanian Foreign Minister Ayman Safadi stated, "The extremist Israeli government continues to violate international law." He emphasized, "There is no lasting peace or stability without fulfilling Palestinian rights," and added, "Israel is undermining all prospects for peace and making Gaza uninhabitable in an attempt to displace its people, which we reject."

Egyptian Foreign Minister Badr Abdel Atty said, "Israel's decision to prevent the visit of the Arab ministerial delegation to Ramallah reflects arrogance and haughtiness." He urged, "The international community must act to confront the humanitarian catastrophe in Gaza," and referenced plans for a Cairo conference focused on early recovery and reconstruction.

Bahraini Foreign Minister Abdullatif bin Rashid Al Zayani called for "an end to the war in Gaza, the release of all hostages, and accelerated humanitarian access," and voiced support for "an international peace conference in New York and full UN membership for Palestine." Arab League Secretary-General Ahmed Aboul Gheit stated, "The committee's meeting with President Abbas revealed new positive points," and added that the talks served as preparation for the international peace conference in New York.

Pope Leo XIV Declares 'I Am Roman!' as He Completes Formalities to Become Bishop of Rome

Pope Leo XIV declared himself a Roman on Sunday as he completed the final ceremonial steps cementing his role as the bishop of Rome.

The first American pope formally took possession of the St. John Lateran Basilica, which is Rome's cathedral and seat of the diocese, with an evening Mass attended by Roman priests and faithful.

In his homily, Leo said he wanted to listen to them "in order to learn, understand and decide things together."

One of the many titles that Leo assumed when he was elected May 8 was bishop of Rome. Given his responsibilities running the 1.4-billion strong universal Catholic Church, popes delegate the day-to-day governance of running of the diocese of Roman to a vicar.

Sunday's ceremonies at the St. John Lateran and a stop at St. Mary Major basilicas follow Leo's visit last week to the St. Paul Outside the Walls basilica. Together with St. Peter's Basilica in the Vatican, the four papal basilicas are the most important basilicas in the West.

Rome's Mayor Roberto Gualtieri welcomed Leo first at the steps to City Hall, noting that his May 8 election fell during a Holy Year, an event occurring every 25 years to invite pilgrims to Rome. The city underwent two years of traffic-clogging public works projects to prepare and expects to welcome upwards of 30 million people in 2025.

Leo said he felt the "serious but passionate responsibility" to serve all Romans during the Holy Year and beyond.

Wearing his formal papal garb, Leo recalled the words he had uttered from the loggia of St. Peter's Basilica on the night of his election. The Augustinian pope quoted St. Augustine in saying: "With you I am Christian, and for you, bishop."

"By special title, today I can say that for you and with you I am Roman!" he said.

The former Robert Prevost replaced Pope Francis, the first Latin American pope. Francis died April 21 and is buried at St. Mary Major, near a beloved icon of the Madonna.

'Limited progress' reported following fifth round of US-Iran nuclear talks

US and Iranian negotiators wrap up a fifth round of nuclear talks in Rome, with mediator Oman reporting "some but not conclusive progress."

A fifth round of high-stakes negotiations between Iranian and US delegations concluded in Oman on Friday, with the mediating nation reporting "some but not conclusive progress" in efforts to resolve a decades-long dispute surrounding Tehran's nuclear ambitions, *Reuters* reported.

Despite public tough stances from both Washington and Tehran ahead of the talks, Iranian Foreign Minister Abbas Araghchi indicated potential for advancement following proposals put forth by Oman during the discussions in Rome.

"We have just completed one of the most professional rounds of talks," Araghchi told state TV. "We firmly stated Iran's position... The fact that we are now on a reasonable path, in my view, is itself a sign of progress." He added that proposals and solutions would be reviewed by both capitals, with the next round of talks to be scheduled accordingly. A senior US official told reporters in a statement that the fifth round of nuclear talks with Iran was "constructive."

"We made further progress, but there is still work to be done," the official stated, adding that both sides agreed to meet again "in the near future." Omani Foreign Minister Badr Albusaidi confirmed on X that the talks between Araghchi and US President Donald Trump's Middle East envoy Steve Witkoff had concluded with limited progress.

Iran has repeatedly insisted that its right to uranium enrichment is "non-negotiable," a stance directly at odds with Witkoff, who has labeled it a "red line".

<u>Araghchi reiterated</u> this stance ahead of the talks, writing in a post on X on Thursday, "Figuring out the path to a deal is not rocket science: Zero nuclear weapons = we DO have a deal. Zero enrichment = we do NOT have a deal. Time to decide..."

The Islamic Republic currently enriches uranium to 60 percent, significantly above the 3.67-percent limit stipulated in the 2015 agreement.

Aussies shaken awake as 'rare' magnitude 5.2 earthquake strikes

Aussies in north-central <u>New South Wales</u> have been shaken awake by a series of early-morning earthquakes with reports of tremors as far away as <u>Queensland</u>.

A magnitude 5.2 <u>earthquake</u> struck the Orana region of NSW at 2.36am on Saturday followed by a magnitude 4.1 aftershock just minutes later. Geoscience Australia reported the initial tremor <u>hit at a shallow depth of 10km and was felt by residents across a wide area, including Nyngan, Carinda, Dubbo, Narromine, Coolah, and Collarenebri.</u>

A third 3.6 magnitude earthquake was recorded at 5.43am.

More than 135 people <u>reporting tremors to Geoscience Australia by 4am</u>. Orana covers approximately 25 per cent of NSW and encompasses 12 local government areas.

A resident in Forbes, 375km west of Sydney, said they felt their house shake. 'Felt my floor vibrate last night twice about 10 minutes apart. Thought there was something under my house,' they said.

India Fires Missiles on Pakistan in What Islamabad Calls 'Act of War'

"There has been no need to use those (nuclear) weapons ... and I hope they will not be required," Putin said. "We have enough strength and means to bring what was started in 2022 to a logical conclusion with the outcome Russia requires."

Russia continues to drag its feet and provides temporary ceasefires that Ukraine says have also been violated, in defiance of the demands of US President Donald Trump.

Russia recently announced that it will cease fire during the Victory Day celebrations over Nazi Germany later this month.

Ukrainian President Vladimir Zelensky responded to the latest Russian ceasefire claims, saying that a full 30-day ceasefire would be the most significant step towards ending the war that has been going on for more than three years.

According to Kahl, Russia will use the period after the war in Ukraine to rebuild its forces to prepare for another attack.

He also claimed that Russia was trying to restore the world order that existed in the past, when it had greater influence on Europe.

These comments come amid pressure from the US on Ukraine to end the war, as well as reports that Trump is considering moving 35,000 US troops from Germany to Hungary.

A magnitude 7.6 earthquake shook the Caribbean Sea southwest of the Cayman Islands on Saturday, according to the U.S. Geological Survey, and some islands and countries urged people near the coast to move inland in case of a tsunami. The quake struck at 6:23 p.m. in the middle of the sea and had a depth of 6.2 miles, the USGS said. The epicenter was 130 miles south-southwest of George Town in the Cayman Islands.

Puerto Rico Gov. Jenniffer González Colón said in a statement she was in contact with emergency agencies after the tsunami advisory, but did not recommend anyone leave the coast.

Hazard Management Cayman Islands urged residents near the coast to move inland and to higher ground. It said wave heights of up to 3.3 feet were expected. The Dominican government also issued a tsunami alert and recommended residents on the coast move to higher, inland areas. It later canceled the alert. The Cuban government requested that people leave beachfront areas. The Bahamas Department of Meteorology also issued a tsunami advisory, but urged its residents to be "vigilant."

Santorini in state of emergency after hundreds of earthquakes shake Greek island for days, sending residents fleeing

A state of emergency was declared on Santorini Thursday after a <u>magnitude 5.2</u> <u>earthquake</u> shook the Greek island late Wednesday. The tremor is the latest —

Ukraine: Russia Might Be Improving North Korea's Missiles

North Korean ballistic missiles fired at Ukraine by Russian forces since late December have been far more precise than salvos of the weapons launched over the past year, two senior Ukrainian sources told Reuters.

At a time when Moscow's burgeoning ties with Pyongyang are causing alarm from Washington to Seoul, the increase in accuracy – to within 50-100m of the intended target – suggests North Korea is successfully using the battlefield to test its missile technology, the sources said. A military source, who requested anonymity to discuss sensitive information, described a marked improvement in the precision in all the more than 20 North Korean ballistic missiles that hit Ukraine over the past several weeks. A second source, a senior government official familiar with the issue, confirmed the findings when asked by Reuters.

China hits back at tariffs, launches Google investigation

Beijing has retaliated against the wave of tariffs President Trump has imposed, including launching investigations against Google and heavily taxing American energy suppliers. Trump's tariffs on Chinese goods have prompted immediate retaliation from Beijing, raising concerns about global economic repercussions. Under Trump's tariff plan, the US implemented 10% tariffs and eliminated an exemption for Chinese exports valued under \$800, affecting retailers like Shein and Temu that rely on this exemption.

China has launched an anti-trust investigation into Google and announced tariffs on US goods including coal, liquefied natural gas, crude oil, farm equipment, large vehicles, and pickup trucks. China also announced export controls on critical minerals like tungsten, tellurium, ruthenium, molybdenum, and ruthenium-related items, citing national security concerns.

According to *The Guardian*, US companies PVH Group (owner of Tommy Hilfiger and Calvin Klein) and Illumina Inc, specializing in genomic sequencing, were added to China's "unreliable entity list," potentially facing restrictions or penalties. The reasons for their inclusion were not specified.

China's finance ministry condemned the US tariffs as a violation of World Trade Organization rules, arguing they harm bilateral economic cooperation.

After a call with Mexico's president, Claudia Sheinbaum, Trump postponed tariffs after she offered to send 10,000 troops to the US-Mexico border. Discussions with Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau resulted in a similar postponement of tariffs. Canada is implementing a border security plan and will designate a "fentanyl czar."

As the US prepares even higher tariffs, the White House announced that Trump would speak with China's president, Xi Jinping, later this week. China has pledged countermeasures and a WTO legal challenge. Economists have warned that Trump's tariffs could increase prices for US consumers. In response, Trump has stated tariffs are a "very powerful" means of strengthening the US economy and achieving desired outcomes. "In all cases, they all wanna make deals." Trump acknowledged the tariffs might cause "a little pain" but maintained they were necessary to "make America great again."

Iran unveils new ballistic missile with range of 1,700 kilometers

Iran unveils Etemad ballistic missile which is capable of reaching Israel.

Iran unveiled a new ballistic missile on Sunday, claiming it has a range of 1,700 kilometers, *AFP* reported.

The missile, named Etemad—meaning "trust" in Persian—was showcased at a ceremony in Tehran attended by President Masoud Pezeshkian, according to the report.

State television aired footage of the missile, describing it as "the most recent ballistic missile" produced by the Iranian defense ministry. With its range, the newly revealed missile is capable of reaching Israel, which Iran targeted twice last year amid the broader regional impact of the Gaza conflict.

"The development of defense capabilities and space technologies... aims to ensure that no country dares to attack Iranian territory," Pezeshkian stated in a televised speech, as quoted by *AFP*.

The unveiling came just one day after Iran's Revolutionary Guards Navy <u>revealed a new underground missile facility</u> along the country's southern coast.

The facility, whose exact location was not disclosed, houses missile systems stored "hundreds of meters underground" and capable of being deployed swiftly, claimed Iranian media

Iran's recent military-related unveilings coincide with <u>large-scale military exercises</u> by the Iranian army and the Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps, which are set to run until mid-March. These drills are focused on safeguarding critical nuclear facilities, including Natanz, Fordow, and Khondab.

The latest military exercises align with the recent inauguration of US President Donald Trump and heightened scrutiny of Iran's nuclear program due to increased uranium enrichment activities.

During Trump's first term, the US withdrew from the 2015 nuclear deal between Iran and world powers. In response, Iran has taken many steps to scale back its compliance with the 2015 agreement.

These steps include <u>banning UN nuclear inspectors</u> from the country as well as <u>expanding uranium enrichment capabilities</u>.

Trump has pledged to reinstate his previous policy of using economic pressure as leverage to compel Iran to negotiate a new agreement addressing its nuclear program, ballistic missile development, and regional influence.

Trump <u>last week stressed</u>, in an interview with Sean Hannity of *Fox News*, that Iran cannot have a nuclear weapon.

7.1 Western China Earthquake Kills at Least 126 in Tibet
